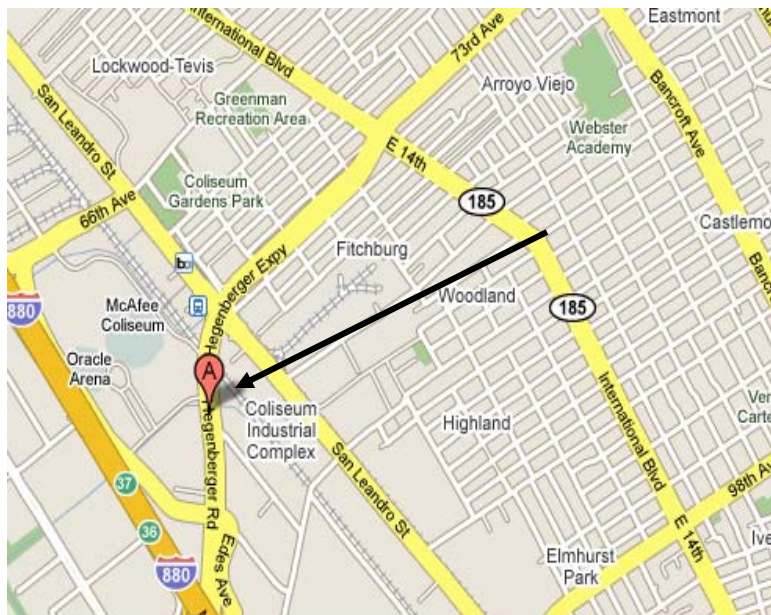

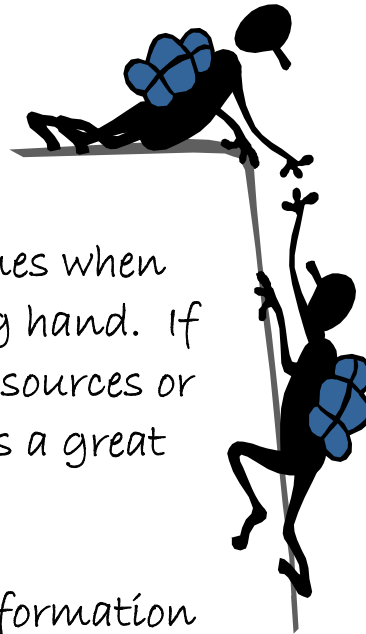

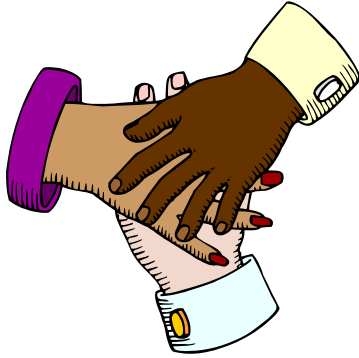
Hello!

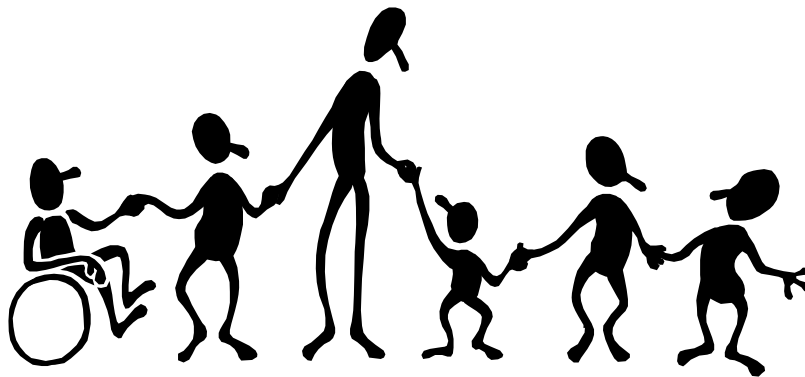

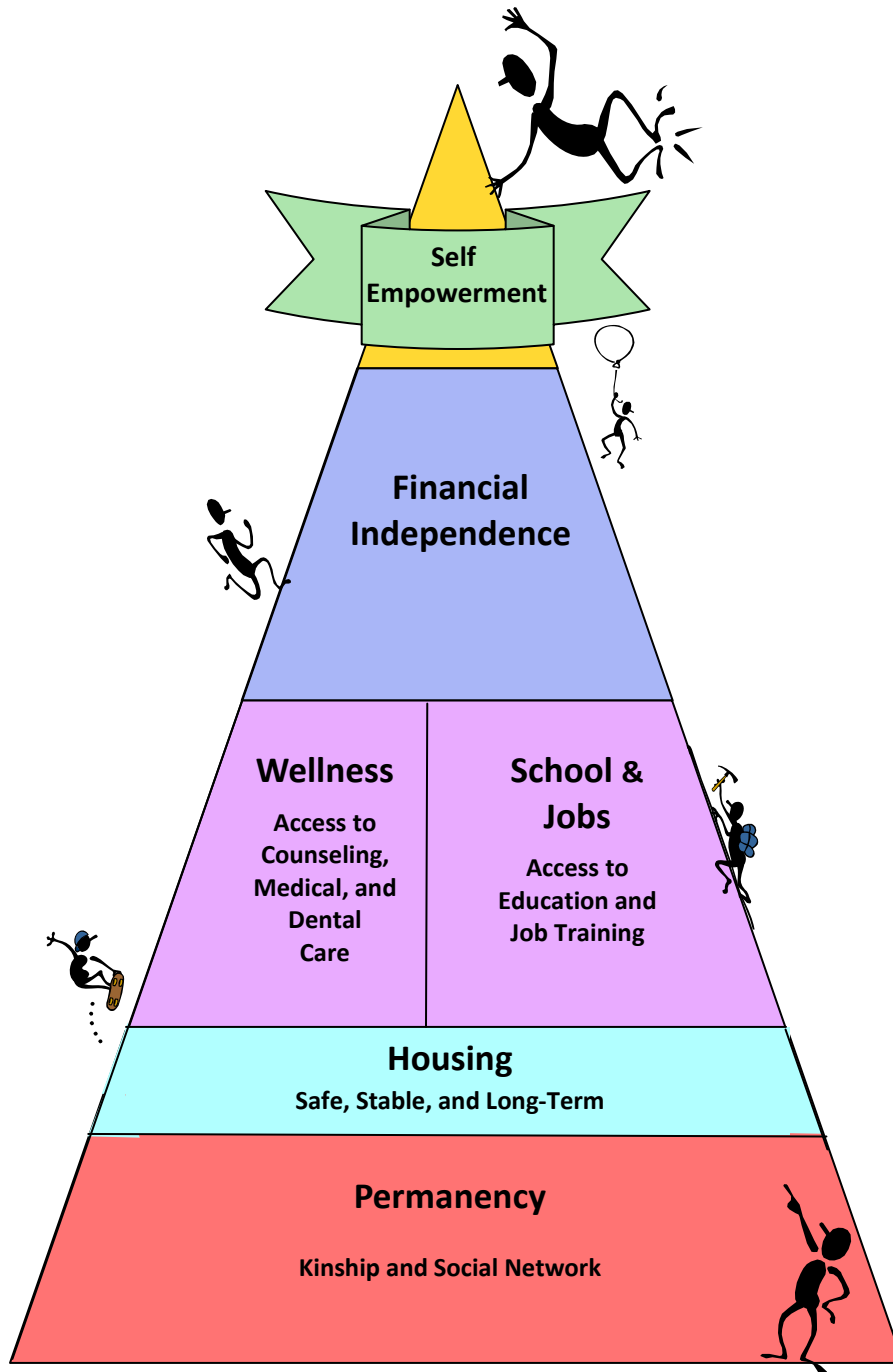

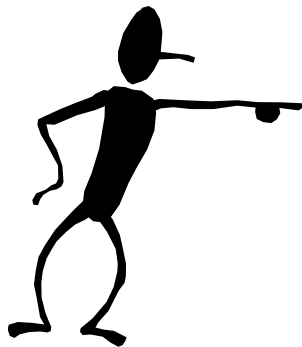
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Our mission is to help Alameda County's current and former foster youth make successful transitions into adulthood and independent living.
